- Candidates must be a CEO, business leader or founder of a privately held company in Canada.
- For businesses with outside capital, the founding entrepreneur may still be nominated if they retain a majority ownership stake of what is left after deducting outside investments.
- If there are multiple cofounders, they may participate as a group if they meet the ownership criteria.
- The company must be at least two years old and 51% Black, Indigenous, Pan-Asian and/or Latino individuals.
- Only for-profit businesses with potential to scale are considered.

Diverse entrepreneurship in Canada:

Approximately 13.6% of Canadian small businesses (1-99 employees) are majority owned by diverse individuals.

These entrepreneurs face systemic barriers, including limited access to capital, mentorship and networks, which affect their ability to scale and sustain their businesses.
