

Overview

This document provides high-level information about jurisdictions worldwide that offer visas or permits for remote workers and digital nomads, or alternative pathways for foreign nationals to work remotely from within their territories. This document also includes information about jurisdictions that introduced visas or permits for remote workers and digital nomads and have since suspended these programs, and jurisdictions where the current rules are ambiguous (e.g., jurisdictions that may be perceived as destinations for remote workers but where specific immigration legislation authorizing remote work is not in place). The information contained in this document includes country names, document (visa/permit) names, government processing times (the amount of time needed by government authorities to evaluate applications for the documents mentioned herein) and lengths of stay (the amount of time that visa holders may remain in the countries that issued the visas).

Policy changes across the globe are being proposed and implemented daily. This document is updated on a quarterly basis. Not all jurisdictions are reflected in this document. The content (and links) herein are true and accurate as of the publication date. This document is provided for informational purposes only and does not constitute legal advice or guarantee the outcome of any application, including applications for admission to foreign destinations. 

Post the COVID-19 pandemic, geographically agnostic working and "work anywhere" models have become a mainstream workforce expectation, whether for freelancers (i.e., individual led) or within corporate global mobility. The demand for globally agile working remains high, driven by continued employee demand, global workforce rebalancing and acute geostrategic and economic challenges. Governments have introduced policies to attract "anywhere workers" at scale, recognizing the competitive benefits of agile working.

The terms "digital nomads," "anywhere workers" and "remote workers" are used interchangeably. These generally refer to individuals who are employed and receive salaries and benefits in one country (i.e., home country) but conduct their day-to-day work activities and responsibilities digitally (e.g., via laptop or smartphone) from within the territorial boundaries of another country (i.e., host country). Digital nomads and remote workers are generally not permitted to earn remuneration from within the host country. Government policies around this persona typically take the form of new visas and permits, or expanded scopes of existing visas and permits, that allow qualifying foreigners to lawfully work remotely from within their borders.

As of the end of July 2024, over 40 jurisdictions offer digital nomad or remote worker visas and permits. Of these, 41% are located in the Americas, 31% in Europe, 14% in the Asia-Pacific region and the other 14% in Africa and the Middle East. Approximately half of all countries that offer digital nomad and remote work visas allow holders of these documents to reside in their territories for an initial period of up to one year. In general, applicants must demonstrate that they are employed or self-employed, meet income requirements and hold insurance policies that cover medical expenses in the host country (and in some cases, repatriation costs).

The first half of 2024 has already seen major movement in visa and permit regulations for digital nomads and remote workers. Korea, Republic of began the year by launching a new pilot program for digital nomads and their dependents. Indonesia, Japan, Thailand and Türkiye followed suit by introducing new digital nomad visas of their own. Italy introduced a visa for remote workers in 2022, but began accepting applications only this year. Greece, which has been issuing digital nomad visas since 2021, recently simplified the application process for this visa type.


Evolution of digital nomad visas


Global map of digital nomad


Nationals of over 180 countries are eligible to apply for this document. The authorities have a list of countries that are restricted from applying for and receiving this visa. These countries include Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Kenya, Philippines, India, Nepal, Nigeria, Venezuela and Vietnam. To obtain the visa, applicants must appear in person at an Ecuadorian embassy or consulate and have their identity and documents reviewed by an embassy/consulate staff member.

Additional comments

The Ecuador digital nomad visa, introduced in 2022 and officially referred to as the Renista for Remote Work Visa, allows foreigners to work remotely and live in the country. Visa holders who remain in Ecuador for 21 months or more in the initial two-year period are eligible to apply for and obtain a Permanent Rentier Visa, which grants them indefinite residence in Ecuador. Holders of Permanent Rentier Visas will forfeit their visas if they remain outside of Ecuador for more than 180 days in either of the first two years of holding the permanent visa. Following this two-year period, individuals may lose their permanent visa if they remain outside of Ecuador for five years continuously.



Estonia



Additional comments

This visa was introduced in 2021. Holders are not permitted to work for a Greek company or conduct business activities while in Greece. They are strictly limited to conducting business and work activities on behalf of their home country employer. The EY processing time may vary from case to case (in some cases, EY shares the application documents with the relevant consulate before filing the application, and in these cases, the time required to prepare the application for filing depends on the time spent by the consulate reviewing the documents submitted by EY and confirming that they can be included in the application). Holders of Digital Nomad Visas have the right of legal residence in Greece, with no access rights to dependent employment or business activity in Greece. The Greek consulate in the applicant's country of residence will issue the visa.

Long-term visas for remote work (introduced in 2020) allow their holders to stay in Iceland for 90 to 180 days for the purpose of working remotely. Remote work refers to the organization and delivery of work utilizing information technology, where the applicant will deliver their work to an operating location outside Iceland. Holders of long-term visas for remote work are not allowed to work for local employers or in any other way participate in the Icelandic labor market. Such jobs require the issuance of a residence and work permit. Individuals who apply from their country of residence and do not travel to Iceland before a decision is made on granting a visa may be issued a long-term visa for remote work for up to 180 days. Individuals who apply after entering the Schengen Area can be issued a long-term visa for remote work for up to 90 days. 

Further, the website for this program is not active, and multiple St. Lucian consulates do not have information regarding this program.

Suspended programs

These jurisdictions introduced visas or permits for remote workers and digital nomads but have since suspended issuance of these documents.

Cayman Islands



The Global Citizen Concierge Program was launched in 2020 to allow global professionals to work and live in the Cayman Islands without applying for citizenship.
