Mexico

New visa requirement for nationals of Peru

Executive summary

Effective 20 April 2024, nationals of Peru must obtain a visa prior to entering Mexico for business, tourism or to transit through the country.

Key developments

Starting on this date, Peruvian nationals will be required to have a visitor visa prior to travel, a passport that is valid for at least 180 days and other supporting documents (e.g., invitation letter, hotel/flight reservation) to be admitted.

Peruvian nationals will remain exempt from presenting a Mexican visa (including for transit purposes) provided they have: (1) a valid visa issued by Canada, Japan, the United States of America, the United Kingdom or any of the countries comprising the Schengen Area, or (2) a valid permanent resident card issued by Canada, Chile, Colombia, Japan, Peru, the United States of America, the United Kingdom or any of the countries comprising the Schengen Area.

Impact on employers

Employers that deploy Peruvian business travelers to Mexico may plan accordingly to mitigate business disruptions.
