Canada's International Experience Canada programs now open for 2021

Executive summary

Canada's International Experience Canada (IEC) program re-opened on 1 March 2021.

Background and impact

The IEC program has been closed since the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic, so the re-opening at this time is hopefully a sign of some normalcy beginning to return to immigration processing in Canada. IEC is a Canadian temporary work permit program that offers young people (generally between the ages of 18 and 35) from certain countries whom Canada has a bilateral agreement with the opportunity to obtain a work permit to work and explore Canada. Under the IEC program there are three categories: Working Holiday, Young Professionals, and International Co-Op (internship), under which foreign nationals can apply for respective employer specific and/or an open work permit.

Key highlights of the program

- Young Professionals category allows individuals who are young professionals (recent graduates) to obtain an employer specific work permit with an offer of employment
- International Co-op (Internship) category applicable for students registered at a post-secondary institution, and who have a job offer for a work placement or internship in Canada as part of their program of study

- International Co-op (Internship) category applicable for students registered at a post-secondary institution, and who have a job offer for a work placement or internship in Canada as part of their program of study
- Working holiday category allows individuals of certain ages to obtain an open work permit, without a job offer, to work in Canada

The duration of work permits will depend on the category under which an individual qualifies, and their nationality.
