e-Invoice Special Voluntary Disclosure Program (SVDP)

With the e-Invoice implementation now largely underway, businesses are entering the next phase of their compliance journey, where the focus is increasingly shifting toward governance, compliance monitoring and data-driven tax administration.

To support businesses in strengthening their compliance position, the Inland Revenue Board of Malaysia (IRBM) has introduced the e-Invoice Special Voluntary Disclosure Program (SVDP), effective from 7 July 2026 to 31 December 2027. The program provides an opportunity for businesses to review and regularize historical e-Invoice non-compliance.

This half-day seminar brings together IRBM representatives alongside our tax, technology and industry professionals to share insights on the evolving e-Invoice landscape, key enforcement and compliance developments, practical lessons from implementation projects, insights from e-Invoicing compliance reviews, common errors and compliance gaps identified by the IRBM, as well as the opportunities available under the SVDP to strengthen compliance readiness.

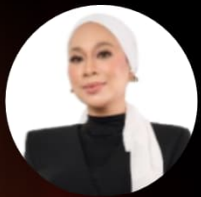
